CALAFCO Annual Conference and Call for Board of Directors and Achievement Award Nominations

Dear Commissioners:

The Annual CALAFCO Conference will be held October 3-5, 2012 at the Hyatt Regency in Monterey. The Conference announcement is attached (Attachment 1). Additional conference information is also available on the CALAFCO website at <u>www.calafco.org</u> and through the LAFCO office.

Each year, prior to the annual conference, CALAFCO issues a call for Board of Director candidates and Achievement Award nominations. The election of CALAFCO Board members and Achievement Award ceremony will take place at the annual CALAFCO conference on Thursday, October 4th.

The CALAFCO Recruitment Committee has opened nominations for the 2013 Board of Directors. There are eight seats up for election this fall, two from each of the four regions. The Coastal Region seats include a County Member and a Special District Member. Commissioner McGill was appointed to the CALAFCO Board in May 2012 to fill an unexpired term ending October 2012. Commissioner McGill has expressed an interest in continuing to serve on the CALAFCO Board of Directors as indicated in the attached (see Attachment 2). Candidates must be nominated by the Commission on which they serve. The deadline for Board nominations is **September 4**. See the attached nomination package for details (Attachment 3).

The CALAFCO bylaws require each member LAFCO to designate a voting delegate to vote on behalf of their Commission. The voting delegate may be a commissioner, alternate commissioner or executive officer. Voting delegates must be designated prior to the annual meeting in October 2012.

Also, nominations are now open for the 2012 CALAFCO Achievement Awards. The awards recognize outstanding achievements by individuals and organizations committed to LAFCO goals and principles. The deadline for award nominations is **August 17**. Please see the attached for details (Attachment 4).

Recommendation: Advise as to any nominations and appoint a voting delegate for Contra Costa LAFCO.



Personal and Professional Background:

I am a Professional Civil Engineer, licensed since 1977 and working in California since 1980. My practice is "municipal engineering". My degrees, from the University of Michigan, are all in engineering which includes a BSCE, MSCE and Masters in Water Resources.

LAFCo Experience:

I first worked with our local LAFCo in the early 1980s as an "applicant/consultant". My service as a Contra Costa LAFCo Commissioner began in February 2011; I was appointed Chair, in March. As Chair, our commission dealt with challenging projects including out of agency service to a \$600 million power plant, a special study focusing on dissolution of a health care district, and completion of a county wide Municipal Service review of law enforcement services. I was re-elected to a four year term in April 2012.

CALAFCO or State-level Experience:

I was nominated and elected to complete a CALAFCO term in 2012 and have attended the Board meetings in May and July.

I have attended last year's CALAFCO state conference and CALAFCO University classes.

Availability:

I'm a consulting engineer in private practice and have a great deal of control over my schedule; I will be able to attend meetings. I'm prepared to pitch in and serve wherever needed and I have the time to be actively involved and to broadly participate. I look forward to serving; I hope I have your support

Other Related Activities and Comments:

I have a good understanding of LAFCo's responsibilities to ensure orderly boundary adjustments, adequate services, efficient and effective government and preservation of open space and agricultural lands. My experience with new land development gives me a critical understanding of efficient service delivery and those conditions that can be imposed by a LAFCo to ensure success.

As part of my Contra Costa LAFCo experience as Board Chair, I was a member of the Contra Costa LAFCo Northeast Antioch Subcommittee addressing island annexations in a potential "disadvantaged under served community" in the area adjacent to the \$600 million power plant to ensure a complete area with adequate municipal service.

I have good "board member" skills and experience. I have been a Regent/Trustee of John F. Kennedy University (Pleasant Hill, CA) since 1989; I was Board Chair from 1998 to 2005 and, as Chair, lead a search committee in 2004 for a new University President (who remains President). Since JFKU's affiliation with the National University System (San Diego, CA) in 2009 I have been a Trustee of National University (campuses through out the state) and the other affiliates.

President / Principal Civil Engineer, MMS Design Associates (MMS)

MMS is a consulting firm which for nearly 30 years has provided development-based services to cities, public agencies, and private sector clients. MMS specializes in large, complex projects involving major infrastructure analysis, funding, financing, long-range planning and design, construction, and contract administration. Mr. McGill's professional planning experience includes consulting with private and public interests on forward planning issues to prepare regional planning studies, feasibility and constraints reports, annexation analysis studies and agreements, Environmental Impact Reports, General Plans, and Specific Plans. McGill Martin Self, Inc (MMS) was part of Contra Costa Water District Los Vaqueros project team that was awarded the ASCE 1999 Outstanding Civil Engineering Achievement.

Board Member, Central Contra Costa Sanitary District (CCCSD);elected 2006, re-elected 2010. CCCSD's mission is to protect public health and the environment by collecting and treating wastewater, recycling water for reuse and promoting pollution prevention. CCCSD focuses on energy conservation using cogeneration in its treatment process, providing 90% of the power required to run the 45 million gallon per day treatment plant (also saving about a million dollars annually in energy costs). Part of this cogeneration system reduces approximately 200 tons of organic material removed from the wastewater each day to less than 14 tons of sterile ash. The ash is then used in commercial fertilizer and not landfill. CCCSD also runs a Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility that collects an average of two tons of waste each year. We then recycle 96% of this waste rather than using it as landfill. In addition, a Pharmaceutical Collection Program and a Source Control (or Pretreatment Section) was established ensuring toxic materials stay out of the wastewater flow and area waters. CCCSD has now been awarded 14 National Association of Clean Water Agencies' Peak Performance Platinum Awards and the California Water Environment Association Large Treatment Plant of the Year Award for 2008. CCCSD was the recipient of the 2011 CALAFCO Government Leadership Award for their innovative boundary clean-up program!

Serving on the CALAFCO Board is a unique opportunity to work with other commissioners throughout the state on legislative, fiscal and operational issues that affect us all. The Board meets four times each year at alternate sites around the state. The time commitment is small but the rewards great! Any LAFCo commissioner or alternate commissioner is eligible to run for a Board seat.

The election will be conducted during regional caucuses at the CALAFCO annual conference prior to the Annual Membership Meeting on Thursday, October 4th, 2012 at the Hyatt Regency Monterey in Monterey, CA.

Please inform your Commission that the CALAFCO Recruitment Committee is accepting nominations for the above-cited offices until Tuesday, September 4th, **2012.** Incumbents are eligible to run for another term. Nominations received by September 4th will be included in the Recruitment Committee's Report, copies of which will be available at the Annual Conference. Nominations received after this date will be returned; however, nominations will be permitted from the floor during the Regional Caucuses or during at-large elections, if required, at the Annual Membership Meeting.

For those member LAFCos who cannot send a representative to the Annual Meeting an electronic ballot will be made available if requested in advance.

Should your Commission nominate a candidate, the Chair of your Commission must complete the attached Nomination Form and the Candidate's Resume Form, or provide the specified information in another format other than a resume.





Commissions may also include a letter of recommendation or resolution in support of their nominee. The nomination forms and materials must be received by the Recruitment Committee Chair no later than Tuesday, September 4th, 2012.

Board of Directors Nomination and Election Procedures and Forms

The procedures for nominations and election of the CALAFCO Board of Directors [Board] are designed to assure full, fair and open consideration of all candidates, provide confidential balloting for contested positions and avoid excessive demands on the time of those participating in the CALAFCO Annual Conference.

The Board nomination and election procedures shall be:

1. APPOINTMENT OF A RECRUITMENT COMMITTEE

- a. Following the Annual Membership Meeting the Board shall appoint a Committee of four members of the Board. The Recruitment Committee shall consist of one member from each region whose term is not ending.
- b. The Board shall appoint one of the members of the Recruitment Committee to serve as Chairman. The CALAFCO Executive Officer shall appoint a CALAFCO staff member to serve as staff for the Recruitment Committee in cooperation with the CALAFCO Executive Director.
- c. Each region shall designate a regional representative to serve as staff liaison to the Recruitment Committee.
- d. Goals of the Committee are to encourage and solicit candidates by region who represent member LAFCos across the spectrum of geography, size, and urban-suburban-rural population, and to provide oversight of the elections process.

2. ANNOUNCEMENT TO ALL MEMBER LAFCOs

- a. No later than three months prior to the Annual Membership Meeting, the Recruitment Committee Chair shall send an announcement to each LAFCo for distribution to each commissioner and alternate. The announcement shall include the following:
 - i. A statement clearly indicating which offices are subject to the election.
 - ii. A regional map including LAFCos listed by region.
 - iii. The dates by which all nominations must be received by the Recruitment Committee. The deadline shall be no later than 30 days prior to the opening of the Annual Conference. Nominations received after the closing date shall be returned to the proposing LAFCo marked "Received too late for Nominations Committee action."
 - iv. The names of the Recruitment Committee members with the Committee Chair's LAFCo address and phone number, and the names and contact information for each of the regional representatives.
 - v. The address to send the nominations forms.
 - vi. A form for a Commission to use to nominate a candidate and a candidate resume form of no more than one page each to be completed for each nominee.
- b. No later than four months before the annual membership meeting, the Recruitment Committee Chair shall send an announcement to the Executive Director for distribution to

each member LAFCo and for publication in the newsletter and on the website. The announcement shall include the following:

- i. A statement clearly indicating which offices are subject to the election.
- ii. The specific date by which all nominations must be received by the Recruitment Committee. Nominations received after the closing dates shall be returned to the proposing LAFCo marked "Received too late for Recruitment Committee action."
- iii. The names of the Recruitment Committee members with the Committee Chair's LAFCo address and phone number, and the names and contact information for each of the regional representatives.
- iv. Requirement that nominated individual must be a commissioner or alternate commissioner from a member in good standing within the region.
- c. A copy of these procedures shall be posted on the web site.

3. THE RECRUITMENT COMMITTEE

- a. The Recruitment Committee and the regional representatives have the responsibility to monitor nominations and help assure that there are adequate nominations from each region for each seat up for election. No later than two weeks prior to the Annual Conference, the Recruitment Committee Chair shall distribute to the members the Committee Report organized by regions, including copies of all nominations and resumes, which are received prior to the end of the nomination period.
- b. At the close of the nominations the Recruitment Committee shall prepare regional ballots. Each region will receive a ballot specific to that region. Each region shall conduct a caucus at the Annual Conference for the purpose of electing their designated seats. Caucus elections must be held prior to the annual membership meeting at the conference. The Executive Director or assigned staff along with a member of the Recruitment committee shall tally ballots at each caucus and provide the Recruitment Committee the names of the elected Board members and any open seats. In the event of a tie, the staff and Recruitment Committee member shall immediately conduct a run-off ballot of the tied candidates.
- c. Make available sufficient copies of the Committee Report for each Voting Member by the beginning of the Annual Conference.
- d. Make available blank copies of the nomination forms and resume forms to accommodate nominations from the floor at either the caucuses or the annual meeting (if an at-large election is required).
- e. Advise the Annual Conference Planning Committee to provide "CANDIDATE" ribbons to all candidates attending the Annual Conference.
- f. Post the candidate statements/resumes organized by region on a bulletin board near the registration desk.
- g. Regional elections shall be conducted as described in Section 4 below. The representative from the Recruitment Committee shall serve as the Presiding Officer for the purpose of the caucus election.
- h. Following the regional elections, in the event that there are open seats for any offices subject to the election, the Recruitment Committee Chair shall notify the Chair of the Board of Directors that an at-large election will be required at the annual membership meeting and to provide a list of the number and category of seats requiring an at-large election.

- 4. ELECTRONIC BALLOT FOR LAFCO IN GOOD STANDING NOT ATTENDING ANNUAL MEETING Limited to the elections of the Board of Directors
 - a. Any LAFCo in good standing shall have the option to request an electronic ballot if there will be no representative attending the annual meeting.
 - b. LAFCos requesting an electronic ballot shall do so in writing no later than 30 days prior to the annual meeting.
 - c. The Executive Director shall distribute the electronic ballot no later than two weeks prior to the annual meeting.
 - d. LAFCo must return the ballot electronically to the executive director no later than three days prior to the annual meeting.
 - e. LAFCos voting under this provision may discard their electronic ballot if a representative is able to attend the annual meeting.
 - f. LAFCos voting under this provision may only vote for the candidates nominated by the Recruitment Committee and may not vote in any run-off elections.

5. AT THE TIME FOR ELECTIONS DURING THE REGIONAL CAUCUSES OR ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING

- a. The Recruitment Committee Chairman, another member of the Recruitment Committee, or the Chair's designee (hereafter called the Presiding Officer) shall:
 - i. Review the election procedure with the membership.
 - ii. Present the Recruitment Committee Report (previously distributed).
 - iii. Call for nominations from the floor by category for those seats subject to this election:
 - 1. For city member.
 - 2. For county member.
 - 3. For public member.
 - 4. For special district member.
- b. To make a nomination from the floor, a LAFCo, which is in good standing, shall identify itself and then name the category of vacancy and individual being nominated. The nominator may make a presentation not to exceed two minutes in support of the nomination.
- c. When there are no further nominations for a category, the Presiding Officer shall close the nominations for that category.
- d. The Presiding Officer shall conduct a "Candidates Forum". Each candidate shall be given time to make a brief statement for their candidacy.
- e. The Presiding Officer shall then conduct the election:
 - i. For categories where there are the same number of candidates as vacancies, the Presiding Officer shall:
 - 1. Name the nominees and offices for which they are nominated.
 - 2. Call for a voice vote on all nominees and thereafter declare those unopposed

candidates duly elected.

- ii. For categories where there are more candidates than vacancies, the Presiding Officer shall:
 - 1. Poll the LAFCos in good standing by written ballot.
 - 2. Each LAFCo in good standing may cast its vote for as many nominees as there are vacancies to be filled. The vote shall be recorded on a tally sheet.
 - 3. With assistance from CALAFCO staff, tally the votes cast and announce the results.
- iii. Election to the Board shall occur as follows:
 - 1. The nominee receiving the majority of votes cast is elected.
 - 2. In the case of no majority, the two nominees receiving the two highest number of votes cast shall face each other in a run-off election.
 - 3. In case of tie votes:
 - a. A second run-off election shall be held with the same two nominees.
 - b. If there remains a tie after the second run-off, the winner shall be determined by a draw of lots.
 - 4. In the case of two vacancies, any candidate receiving a majority of votes cast is elected.
 - a. In the case of no majority for either vacancy, the three nominees receiving the three highest number of votes cast shall face each other in a run-off election.
 - b. In the case of no majority for one vacancy, the two nominees receiving the second and third highest number of votes cast shall face each other in a run-off election.
 - c. In the event of a tie, a second run-off election shall be held with the tied nominees. If there remains a tie after the second run-off election the winner shall be determined by a draw of lots.

6. ADDITIONAL PROCEDURES

- a. For categories where there are more candidates than vacancies, names will be listed in the order nominated.
- b. The Recruitment Committee Chair shall announce and introduce all Board Members elected at the Regional Caucuses at the annual business meeting.
- c. In the event that Board seats remain unfilled after a Regional Caucus, an election will be held immediately at the annual business meeting to fill the position at-large. Nominations will be taken from the floor and the election process will follow the procedures described in Section 4 above. Any commissioner or alternate from a member LAFCo may be nominated for at-large seats.
- d. Seats elected at-large become subject to regional election at the expiration of the term. Only

representatives from the region may be nominated for the seat.

e. As required by the Bylaws, the members of the Board shall meet as soon as possible after election of new board members for the purpose of electing officers, determining meeting places and times for the coming year, and conducting any other necessary business.


7. LOSS OF ELECTION IN HOME LAFCO

Board Members and candidates who lose elections in their home office shall notify the Executive Director within 15 days of the certification of the election.

8. FILLING BOARD VACANCIES

Vacancies on the Board of Directors may be filled by appointment by the Board for the balance of the unexpired term. Appointees must be from the same category as the vacancy, and should be from the same region.

These policies and procedures were adopted by the CALAFCO Board of Directors on 12 January 2007 and amended on 9 November 2007, 8 February 2008, 13 February 2009, 12 February 2010, 18 February 2011, and 29 April 2011. They supersede all previous versions of the policies.
